Maintain minimum 3' diameter of no-grass around tree trunk at all times.

Autumn Gold Gingko	<i>Ginkgo biloba 'Autumn Gold'</i>	Free of disease and pest, Yellow fall color	45'
Northern Acclaim Honeylocust	<i>Gleditsia triacanthos 'Harve'</i>	Hardest of the honeylocust, filtered shade	35-45'
Shademaster Honeylocust	<i>Gleditsia triacanthos 'Shademaster'</i>	Thornless, filtered shade	50-60'
Skyline Honeylocust	<i>Gleditsia triacanthos 'Skyline'</i>	Distinctive pyramidal shape	50'
Kentucky Coffeetree	<i>Gymnocladus dioicus</i>	Insect and disease resistant	50-60'
*Crabapple	<i>Malus</i>	Variety of shape, size, and flower	10-25'
Ironwood	<i>Ostrya virginiana</i>	Native to SD, Few pest problems	30-50'
Quaking Aspen	<i>Populus tremuloides</i>	Attractive leaves and bark, prone to sucker	65'
*Amur Chokecherry	<i>Prunus maackii</i>	Interesting metallic, exfoliating bark	20-30'
*Canada Red Select Cherry	<i>Prunus virginiana 'Shubert Select'</i>	Dark red summer foliage, Can sucker	20-25'
Northern Pin Oak	<i>Quercus ellipsoidalis</i>	Red fall color	60'
Bur Oak	<i>Quercus macrocarpa</i>	Native, Moderately fast growth	60'
Praire Stature Oak	<i>Quercus x bimundorum 'Midwest'</i>	Semi-glossy foliage, Pyramidal shape, red fall color	40'
Heritage Oak	<i>Quercus x macdanielii 'Clemons'</i>	Glossy, tatter resistant foliage	60'
*Regal Prince Oak	<i>Quercus x warei 'Long'</i>	Upright, narrow shape	50'
*Japanese Tree Lilac	<i>Syringa reticulata</i>	Creamy white flowers in June	25'
American Linden	<i>Tilia american</i>	Large tree, Pyramidal shape	70'
Little Leaf Linden	<i>Tilia cordata</i>	Smaller linden, Pyramidal shape	50'
Harvest Gold Linden	<i>Tilia x mongolica</i>	Hardy, great fall color	40'
Triumph Elm	<i>Ulmus 'Morton Glossy'</i>	Hybrid elm. Disease and pest resistant	60'
Accolade Elm	<i>Ulmus 'Morton'</i>	Hybrid elm, American Elm-like form	70'
Prairie Expedition American Elm	<i>Ulmus americana 'Lewis & Clark'</i>	True American Elm, DED resistance	55'
St. Croix American Elm	<i>Ulmus americana 'St. Croix'</i>	True American Elm, DED resistance	65'
Princeton American Elm	<i>Ulmus americana 'Princeton'</i>	True American Elm, DED resistance	65'
