Quaking Aspen | *Populus tremuloides*



Plant description

The small leaves of this native tree tremble in the slightest breeze for a beautiful effect. It is indifferent to soil conditions, and can be found in moist, shallow, rocky, or clay soils. The bark is an attractive greenish white. This is an excellent tree for naturalizing. The seed strain we use at Bailey Nurseries is resistant to black spot.

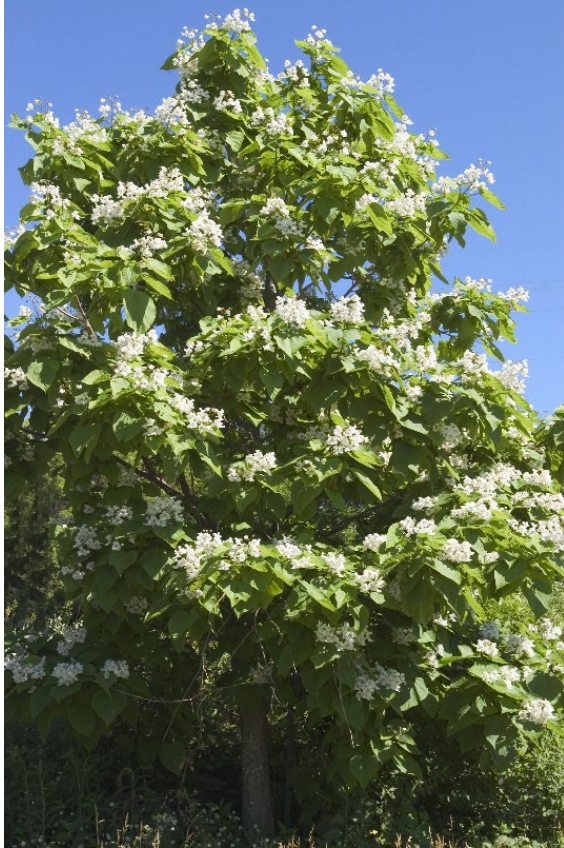

This fast growing tree has few branches at an early age. Once branched, ascending limbs are gnarled and twisted. In June, 2" long, tube-like white flowers appear in 4-8" panicles. Fruit is a long persistent pod. Great for xeriscapes, it is very tolerant and adaptable.

Glossy bronze-purple leaves are darker and glossier than Purple Prince, remain lush all season long and are highly disease resistant. Gladiator is an ideal ornamental tree for space-challenged sites including under power lines, as a small boulevard tree or planted in a row for a screen. This is an open pollinated selection of 'Royalty'. Selected by Rick Durand, from Portage la Prairie MB, CA. (®CA)

Fall foliage changes from green to apricot-orange to burgundy-red before leaf drop. Size and form permit use in smaller homeowner and business landscapes, parks, and boulevard plantings.

Displaying a high resistance to the disease, it averages three to four feet of growth annually. Dark green foliage on the classic elm vase shaped canopy will provide quick shade in a variety of locations from cold prairies to harsh urban environments. Hardy to USDA Zone 2b.

Introduced through Chicagoland Grows®, it has an upright habit with strong branching, lustrous dark green foliage and excellent disease and pest resistance.

Thornless and seedless, it has a rather upright form similar to Skyline®, and gradually widens with age. This sturdy, vigorous tree is quite drought-resistant as well.

Leathery, glossy, deep green leaves are resistant to leaf tatter and leafhopper damage. A rapid grower, easy to transplant and also resistant to sun scald and frost cracks. Outstanding fall color, shows far more oranges and reds than other sugar maples. Prefers a moist yet well-drained soil with a slight acidity for optimum growth.

Fall color is bright orange to scarlet and develops fairly early. This is a distinct advantage over some existing Freeman maple cultivars that color later and often do not develop much color in northern regions before freezing temperatures cause the foliage to drop. University of Minnesota introduction.

Introduced in collaboration North Dakota State University and North Central Regional Plant Introduction Station, Iowa State University, Ames, Iowa.

Northern Red Oak | *Quercus rubra*

Autumn Splendor Buckeye | *Aesculus x arnoldiana* 'Autumn Splendor'



Plant description

Buckeyes are beautiful native trees but this one is special because of its brilliant red fall color. Spring brings large white panicles of blooms that are touched with red and yellow. The foliage shows good disease resistance to scorch and leaf blotch. Autumn Splendor was named for its vivid maroon-red fall color. Prefers moist soil and full sun for best flower production. From the University of Minnesota.

Apples (*Malus*)

Varieties marked (*) are grafted on a semi-dwarfing rootstock (S-M7) which will produce trees approximately 60% the size of standard apple trees. This will generally result in trees approximately 12-15' tall and 14' wide at maturity. This rootstock will cause trees to produce fruit at an earlier age-usually 4-5 years after planting.

Trunk caliper is generally 1 1/16".

Apples do benefit from cross pollination. Chose multiple varieties with similar bloom time.

Connell Red | *Malus 'Connell Red'*



Plant description

('McIntosh' x 'Longfield') University of Minnesota, 1943. A red blush mutation of 'Fireside' apple. Similar to 'Fireside' except that it has more intense red color. Hardy, heavy bearer. Large size. Excellent for eating or cooking. Distinctive flavor. Fruit keeps well until April or May. Unsuitable pollinator for 'Fireside'.

Cortland Apple | *Malus 'Cortland'*

Plant description

('Ben Davis' x 'McIntosh') New York, 1915. An older, well-known variety. Medium-sized and bright red with a sprightly tropical flavor. White flesh holds its color well after being cut. Excellent for eating and cooking.

Fireside Apple | *Malus 'Fireside'*



Plant description

('McIntosh' x 'Longfield') University of Minnesota, 1943. Large, red striped fruit with a sweet, pleasant flavor. Excellent flavor good for eating. Good storage life. One of the most popular apples in Minnesota. Resistant to cedar-apple rust. Unsuitable pollinator for 'Connell Red'.

Haralred Apple | *Malus 'Lautz'*

Plant description

A Bailey Nurseries introduction, this red selection of 'Haralson' apple was discovered by Louis Lautz, an orchardist from La Crescent, MN. The fruit is redder and earlier than the standard 'Haralson', yet retains all the good qualities of 'Haralson': juicy, tart, firm, good keeper, extremely hardy and fireblight resistant. This is an excellent variety for northern United States and Canada. Unsuitable pollinator for 'Haralson'.

Honeycrisp | *Malus 'Honeycrisp'*



Plant description

('Keepsake' x unnamed seedling) University of Minnesota, 1991. An exciting apple that is exceptionally crisp and juicy. Flavor is sweet but well-balanced. Excellent storage life, up to 7 months. Has been rated equal to or higher in overall quality than 'Haralson', 'Honeygold' or 'Keepsake' in winter storage trials. Ripens in late September in Minnesota and stores like a late season variety. Has become an outstanding commercial and home orchard variety because of its explosive crispness, flavor and storage life. CPBR #1007, C®

Honeygold Apple | *Malus 'Honeygold'*

Plant description

(Golden 'Delicious' x 'Haralson') University of Minnesota, 1969. Medium to large, yellow apple. Fruit is crisp, juicy and sweet. Excellent for eating as well as cooking. Medium storage life. Similar to Golden 'Delicious', but hardier.

KinderKrisp Apple | *Malus 'KinderKrisp'*



Plant description

Exceptional flavor and crisp texture, much like its parent Honeycrisp, this early ripening variety features much smaller fruit. Perfect size for snacking or kid's lunches, with a good balance of sweet flavors and a crisp, juicy bite. Outstanding variety for homeowners, flowering early in the season and ripening in late August, the fruit is best fresh from the tree, hanging on for an extended period.

Kudos Apple | *Malus 'MN 33' PPAF*

Plant description

This apple features a unique blend of characteristics, including a juicy texture and sweet, balanced flavor with a hint of tropical overtones. Kudos® is a cross between Honeycrisp and Zestar!®, with a similar or slightly later harvest date than Honeycrisp. Like Honeycrisp, this selection is somewhat tolerant of scab. Kudos® has a spreading habit with medium to high vigor. Introduced by the University of Minnesota.



Red Regent Apple | *Malus 'Red Regent'*

Plant description

('Daniels Red Duchess' x 'Delicious' Red) University of Minnesota, 1963. Very popular apple in Minnesota. Medium to large red apple. Flesh is juicy and crisp. Flavor is an outstanding balance of sweet and tart. Excellent for fresh eating and cooking. Good storage life. Becoming one of the most popular apples in Minnesota.



Zestar! Apple | *Malus 'Minnewashta'*



Plant description

('State Fair' x Minnesota selection) University of Minnesota, 1998. A wonderful new apple cultivar from the the University of MN. At last, an early apple that is crisp and juicy! Best known for its excellent sweet tart flavor. Has a much longer storage life than other early apples. Excellent for fresh eating and cooking. Ripens in late August in Minnesota.

Pears (*Pyrus*)

Parker Pear | *Pyrus 'Parker'*

1934 University of Minnesota introduction. Open-pollinated seedling of a Manchurian pear. Large, yellow-bronze fruit. Fine grained, tender and juicy. Upright and vigorous grower. Pollinator for 'Luscious'.

Summercrisp Pear | *Pyrus 'Summercrisp'*



Height: 12-15'

Plant description

MNRC - Recognized for many years as the hardiest pear from the University of Minnesota, released in 1985. Free of fireblight. An annual bearer. Fruit is pyriform in shape, 2.5-3" in diameter and 3-3.5" long. Blooms early in May. The fruit should be harvested in mid-August when crisp and still green with a red blush. Fruit harvested at that time is sweet and crisp, and may be stored up to 2 months. Use either 'Parker' or 'Patten' as pollinator.

Peach, Cherry, Plum

(*Prunus*)

Peach and Cherries are self-fruitful while plums mostly need a pollinator.

Contender Peach | *Prunus x 'Contender'*

Plant description

A freestone peach with bright yellow flesh. Matches 'Reliance' in cold-hardiness and tolerance of spring frosts. Sweet, extra-juicy fruit is an absolute delight for fresh eating, canning, baking, and freezing. Self-pollinating. 'Contender' ripens mid-to-late August.

Evans Bali Cherry | *Prunus cerasus 'Evans Bali'*

Deep, dark red fruit 1" in diameter and excellent for baking and fresh eating. The fruit is much sweeter than other sour cherries. Extremely hardy buds.

First Editions® Sweet Cherry Pie™ Cherry | *Prunus 'Eubank'*

Plant description

Although, not quite for fresh eating like a 'Bing', they are fantastic for jams, jellies, and pies. With its compact size, this is a great tree for the home garden or small orchard.

Caroline Raspberry | *Rubus 'Caroline'*

This is a University of Maryland variety that has proven to be one of the most productive varieties for the East and Midwest. It is considered to be the new standard for everbearing varieties.
